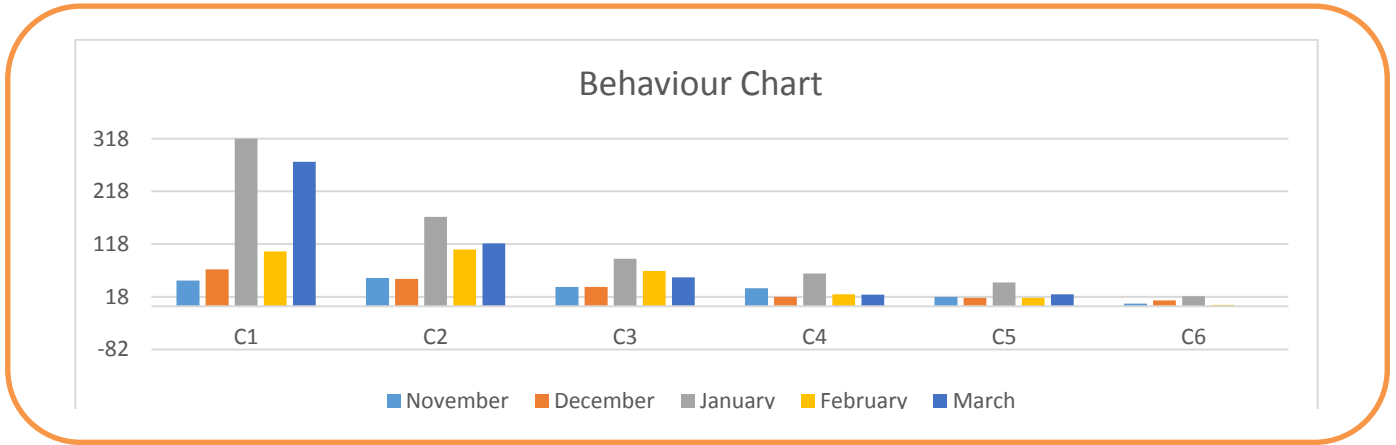

### Early Years Foundation Stage

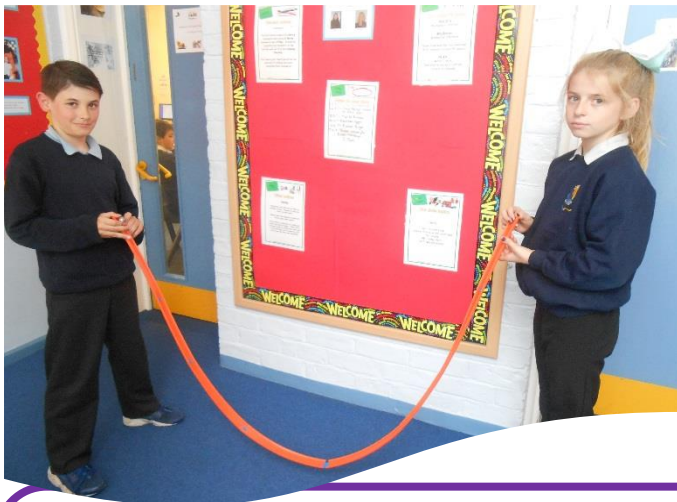
Nursery have had an adventurous week with their topic, 'Can we explore it?' The children have been exploring their fabulous new water wall and had a fantastic time.
