

Early Years Foundation Stage

Nursery have been very busy learning and reading all about bears and bear stories. We focussed mainly on the story by Michael Rosen call 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. To celebrate our topic, we held our very own bear hunt in the playground and even had a Teddy Bear's Picnic. The sun was shining and we have a great time.

We also had great fun making our own obstacle courses and balancing activities. These quickly turned into Pirate Hunt as we made a pirate ship outside.



YEAR 1/2

Years 1/2 have been tasting different fruits from the story Handa's Surprise. They have been describing the fruits using adjectives. Well done to Year 1 who have worked very hard on their Phonics Tests.



YEAR 3/4

During this week year 3/4 have been looking at data handling. They have looked at pictograms, tally charts and bar charts. The week has ended with them answering a question Nestle set them. The question was:

"Does every tube of Smarties contain the same number of each colour?"

The children had a tube of Smarties and had to tally them and then produce a bar chart. The best part was they got to eat them at the end.



YEAR 5/6

As part of their work on allotments, the children have been researching the conditions needed to grow sunflowers successfully, and how to care for them before and after germination. They then planted their sunflower seeds following the guidelines they had found. The seeds should germinate in 1-2 weeks, and the flowers should begin to grow after 8 weeks. The children will be able to take their plants home during the holidays. We have asked them to measure and record the heights of their sunflowers and take a photograph if possible.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Please check your child's hair frequently. If you find headlice, don't panic! Here's what to do:

- Smother your child's hair in conditioner and comb through with a fine bug-busting comb. Do this over a light surface so that you can see the head lice as they fall out.
- Repeat every night for two weeks. If you don't do this, the eggs will hatch and your child will get headlice again.
- You will need to check and treat everyone who lives in your house as they spread easily.
- Keep checking your child's hair from time to time. They are easier to get rid of if there is only a few.

You can also get chemical treatment for head lice, ask your chemist for details about this.
